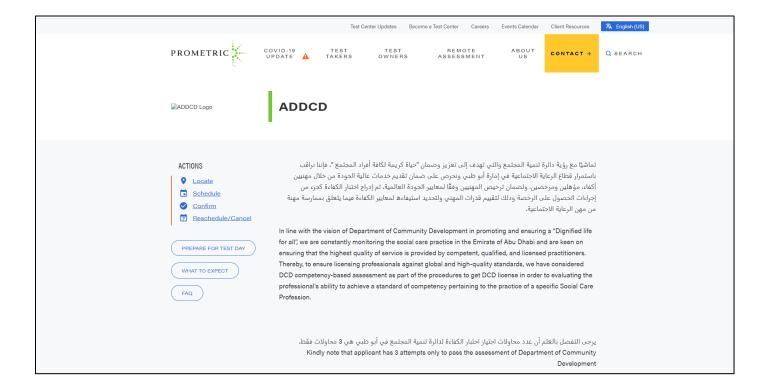

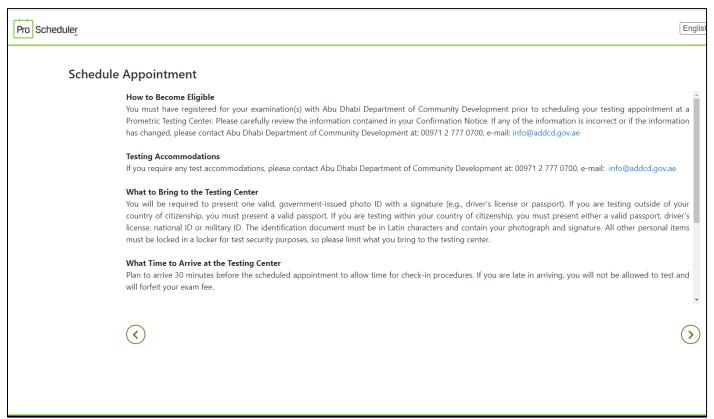

Registration and Administration of the Exams

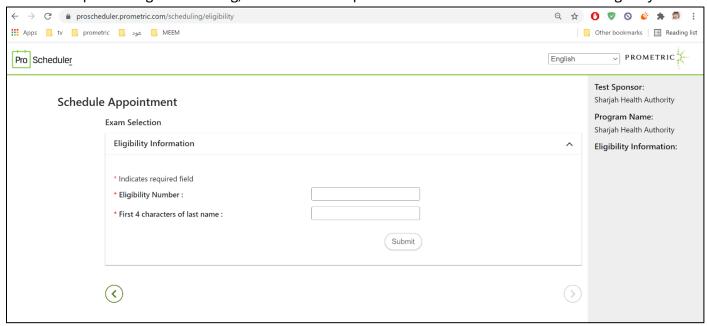
- 1. Access the TAMM platform to search for related information.
- 2. Go to DataFlow website to submit a primary source verification request for the required educational & experience documents.
- 3. If you are eligible for the applied title based on the submitted educational qualification & paratactical experience certification, you will receive a notification email with a direct access link to the exam website, and you will be provided with an eligibility number for your exam
- 4. To register for a test, visit Prometric.com/ADDCD:



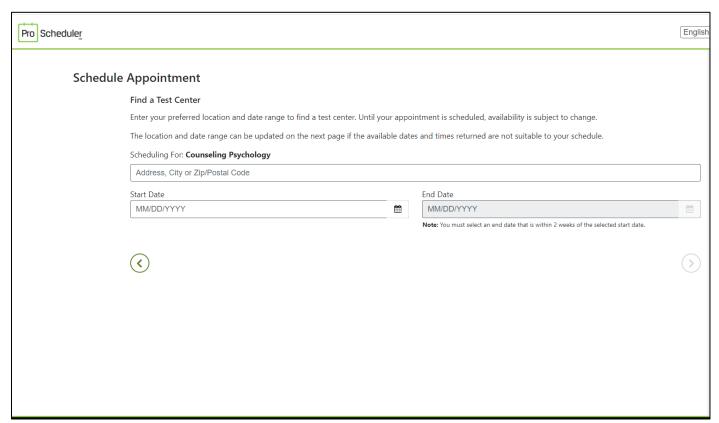
5. Information about the scheduling an appt and test fee:



6. Upon clicking on scheduling, candidates will be presented with the below screen to enter eligibility ID:




7. Candidates will then search for the preferred location and date of the test:




8. After supplying the location, candidates will need to choose the preferred time for the test:

Structure and Timing of the Exams

1. Social Work

1.1. The Social Work exam consists of 100 questions to be completed within 2 hours (120 minutes)

2. General Counseling

2.1. The General Counselling exam consists of 100 questions to be completed within 2 hours (12 minutes)

3. Psychologist and Therapist in Social Care

- 3.1. Candidates for these exams will take a general Psychology section consisting of 80 questions, plus one Specialization section based on their related practice, consisting of 20 questions. All 100 questions must be completed within 2 hours.
- 3.2. The Psychology Specializations include the following areas, to be specified by the Licensing Team in DCD after reviewing the candidate's educational qualification and practical experiences.:
 - 3.2.1. Counselling Psychologist
 - 3.2.2. Educational Psychology
 - 3.2.3. Forensic Psychology
 - 3.2.4. Marriage and Family Psychology
 - 3.2.5. Psychotherapist
 - 3.2.6. School Psychology

Content Tested in the Exams

1. Tested Domains

1.1. All questions in the exams target a specific Domain of knowledge and practice, defined by DCD as below:

Professional Knowledge	The knowledge and understanding required of the profession and the ability to apply this knowledge safely and effectively
Values, Ethics and Legality	The ability to uphold the values of the profession within the legal and ethical boundaries
Fitness to Practice	The need to maintain their physical and mental wellbeing, and to build resilience and effective coping mechanisms into their everyday practice
Professional Assessments	The ability to apply their knowledge and skills to assess a situation and apply their professional judgement effectively
Critical Thinking and Interventions	The ability to apply appropriate profession-related methods and theories to identify interventions and develop plans with the Beneficiary or client to achieve their objectives and goals
Equality, Diversity and Inclusion	The ability to understand and recognize the impact that socio-economic status, culture, traditions and religion may have, be inclusive of these and adapt their practice accordingly
Confidentiality	The ability to maintain confidentiality and recognize situations where this should be waived
Communication	The ability to communicate appropriately and effectively in a given situation
Records Management	The ability to maintain clear and accurate records
Self-Evaluation	The ability to self-evaluate one's own practice
Practice Management	The ability to establish and maintain a safe and effective practice environment
Professional Relationships	The ability to maintain effective professional relationships

Question Types and Sample Questions

- 1. All questions on all exams have the format of 4-choice multiple choice.
- 2. All questions have equal value in calculating the final score.
- 3. There are two primary question types: Knowledge and Scenario.
 - 3.1. Knowledge items assess candidates' factual knowledge and understanding of concepts critical to their field.
 - 3.2. Example of a Knowledge item:

In psychotherapy, what term is used to describe an individual's self-perpetuating cycle of interpersonal representations when responding to difficulties in the therapeutic relationship?

- a. Relational matrix
- b. Relational configuration
- c. Interpersonal object orientation
- d. Interpersonal schema
- 3.3. Scenario items assess candidates' judgment in specific concrete situations likely to be encountered in professional practice, and their understanding of how to apply their professional knowledge.
- 3.4. Example of a Scenario item:

You are working with a mother of an infant who cannot bear to put her child down even for a second. The mother fears that harm will happen to the child. Which theoretical concept would be most relevant to apply in this case?

- a. Facilitating environment: This might help alleviate the mother's anxiety around separation from her child.
- b. Denial: There is a child care issue, so you might use some regression techniques to loosen this bond.
- c. Fixation: You might try free associating meaning around motherhood and care.
- d. Representation: You might ask the mother to outline her fears of what will happen to the child and explore aspects of her active imagination.

Exam Results
